If you are just beginning classes or have joined the mailing list you will be asked to bring along an ‘image’

This is to work from in class. **A bigger size and better quality image is easier to see and to paint and draw from.**

Heres 3 tips to get you on your way



THE INTERNET

1. Type into Google or search engine the artist e.g. Picasso or subject i.e. red flower. Then find the area below your typing where it says ‘images’ click on that and see all of the results in image form. If you have a printer, use heavyweight paper and the proper setting for the printer e.g. heavyweight (stops lines)
2. Want to keep that red flower? You can right click on your mouse and ‘save it’ or click on it to enlarge and then take a ‘screen shot’ (Apple users). Search Google how to do this

MAGAZINES AND LIBRARY BOOKS

1. Worthing Library has a super art section and a lot of artists books, you can loan out up to 10 books!
2. Why not paint from a photograph in a magazine that inspires you, magazines are great for collage too.

IPAD OR MOBILE DEVICE

1. Bring your iPad or tablet along to class. You will be able to login to the Internet and I will be able to show you how to screen save an image. Don’t forget your password
2. Mobile phones are quite small to use so you need good eyesight!
